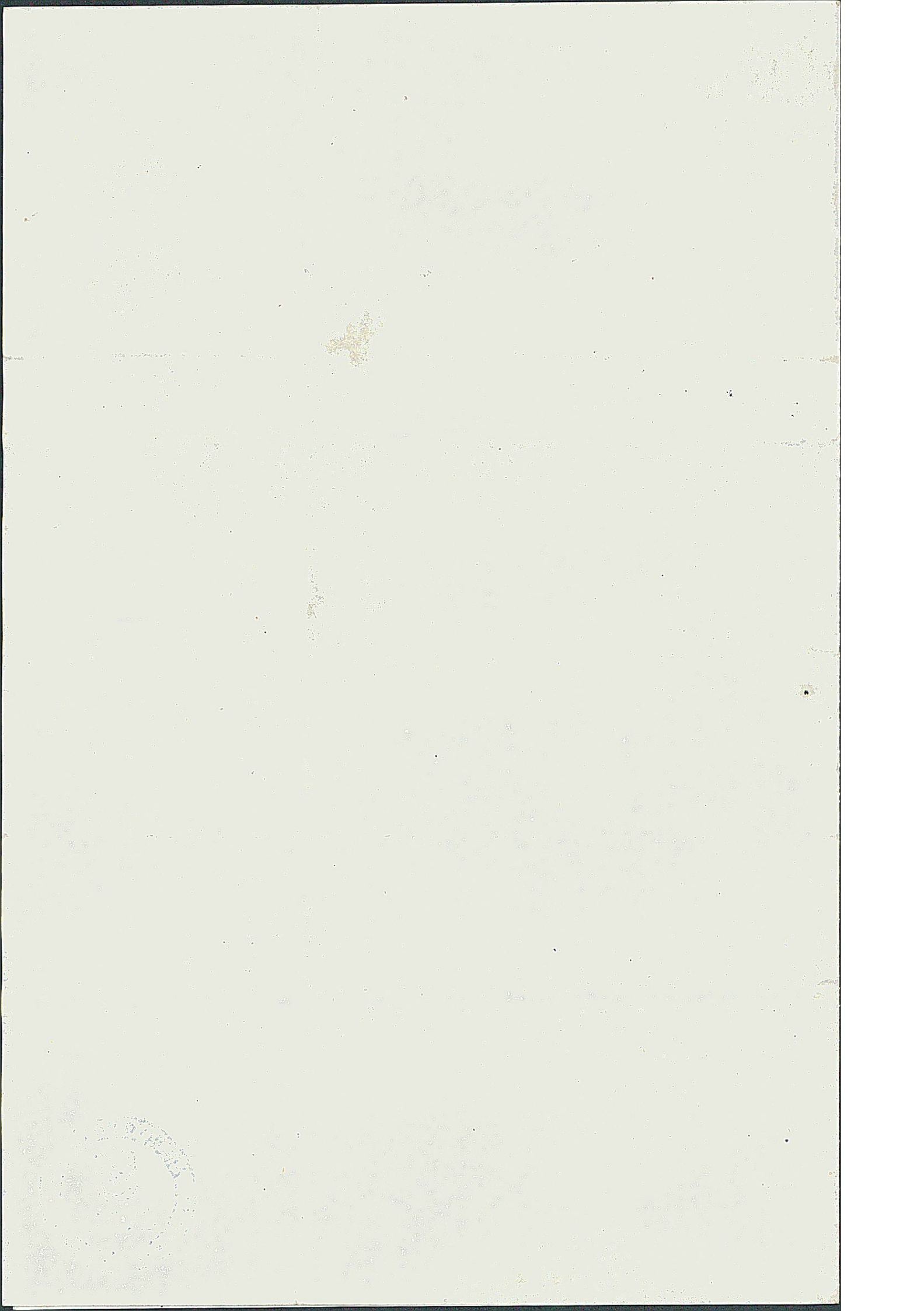

Mr. H. de Ayala presents his compliments to Mr. Fitz Patrick & begs to say in answer to the favour of yesterday that he has not yet received the letter Mr. Fitz Patrick wrote him on Saturday last, containing the notice of the expenses for the voyage of the two men to Liverpool; and prays Mr. Fitz Patrick to send him such particulars, in order to reimburse those expenses as soon as possible.

Mr. de Ayala also remembers to Mr. Fitz Patrick the necessity of concluding the little account with Messrs Breaue & Wingrove, for which he marks the weight of the twelve collections of blanks struck by Mr. Wagon, taking notice of the filings, both of gold & silver. - This being the difference ^{of weight}, for which we are accountable, ~~of weight~~ between the original ^{weight} of the two bars and



and that of the rest, which must be returned to
Mr. Wroome & Wengrow.

Notwithstanding the conclusion of this account we want
yet a little silver bar of the same standard weighing
about 24 ounces to make 12 blanks for striking 12 pieces
of the Granada's: and Mr. de Azula, ^{hoped} Mr. Fitch & Vassich will
be so kind as to ask it —

Messrs Maudslay regret that it is not in their
 power to comply with the request of His Excellency relative
 to preparing the 12 Blanks for the "Granadino" Coins as they
 have no means of rolling the two small bars of Selae
 remaining from the former operation - they would therefore
 recommend that these bars be handed over to Mr Wign
 for whom Messrs Maudslay have already adapted a fitting
 out Machine in Mr Wign's workshop for the above purpose.

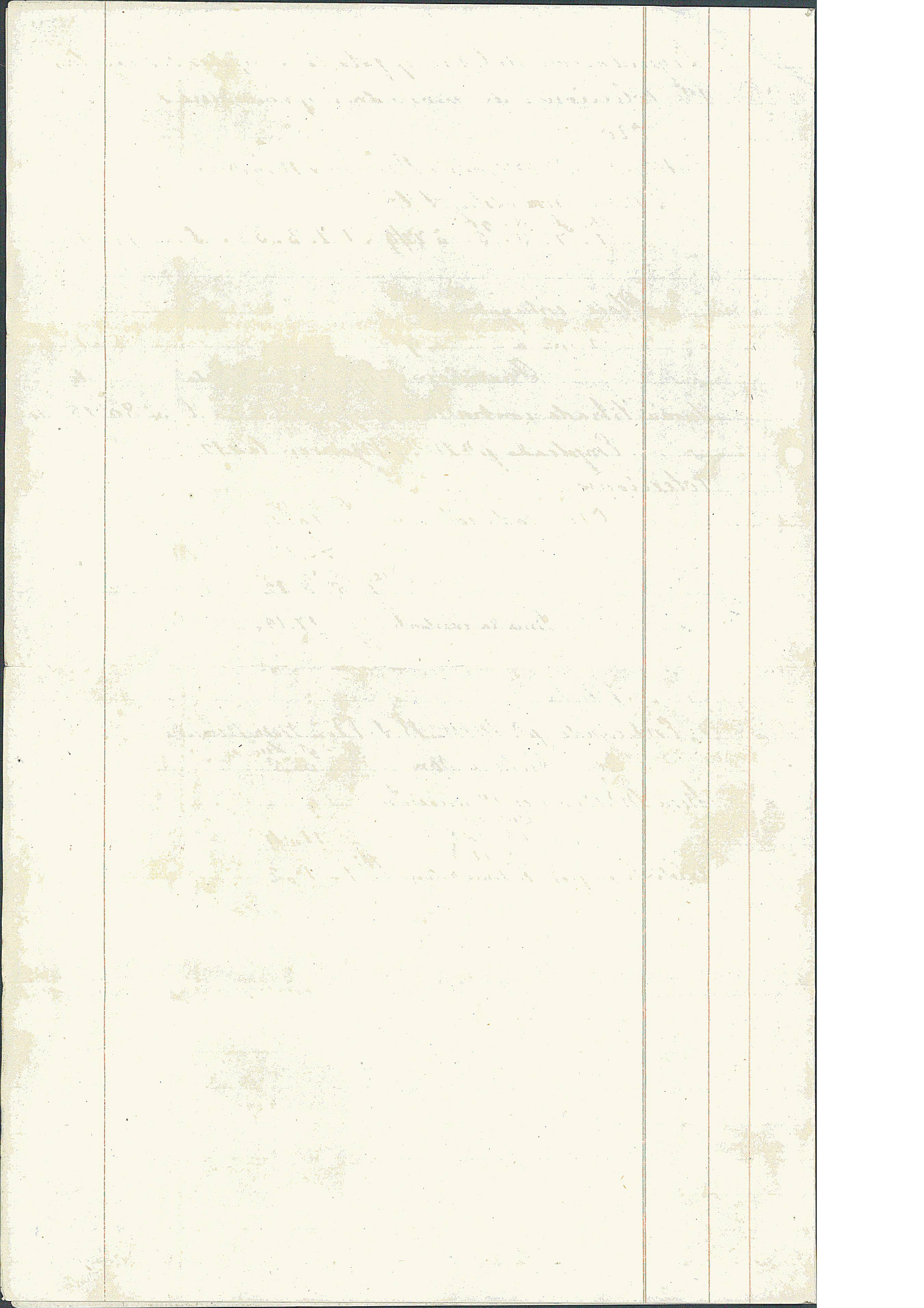
