Before I left Panama I made  
a Will in conformity with the  
laws of the country, having some  
property. I wish there to be  
divided between my two children  
Jela & Guate, as the property  
is real I want to know if  
I can <sup>leave</sup> ~~leave~~ share to her during

her life ten with remainder  
to her children, & their issue.

To do to benefit the property





from falling into the hands of  
the Creditors of Herbert's Estate  
as I do hereby certify and hold  
myself bound to do so inasmuch  
as it would be better by law  
herewith. By the signature  
your, real estate, I believe  
can be placed in the hands  
of Trustees for the benefit of  
children, & I wish by you  
to let you know if there is any  
law in Colorado to prevent  
this. As I intend to make my  
Will in England I wish to  
arrange all affairs that  
hereafter in Pennsylvania.
